About the program

A Master of Arts in Indigenous Education builds relevant skills in culturally relevant research, theory, and practice. Created for anyone that supports educational opportunities and community-driven outcomes for Indigenous peoples. We prepare leaders in education, non-profit, tribal, and government entities guiding the future of Indigenous people's education. With two tracks learners can focus on American Indian/Alaska Native education or Native Hawaiian education. Degrees can be completed online within 12 months, without having to leave your community!

Our dynamic curriculum offers a deep dive into diverse Native Hawaiian, Alaska Native, and American Indian knowledge systems, Indigenous pedagogies, global Indigenous research approaches, and diverse forms of community engagement. Courses conclude with a capstone project experience led by students who collaborate with Indigenous researchers, practitioners in the field, and even community leaders and apply Indigenous knowledges, pedagogies, and perspectives to develop solutions for advancing community goals for education!

Career outlook

This degree prepares graduates for careers in community-driven programming, education initiatives, cultural preservation, state and tribal education departments, community schools and similarly relevant organizations.

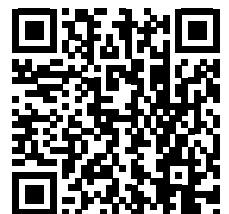
