Test-Free Admissions

Education is ever-changing and ever-expanding. In years past, much weight was placed on the importance of national tests such as the ACT and SAT with regard to college admissions. In our post-COVID years, these tests hold less relevance, not only to college admissions, but also to the reception of college scholarships.

Today, fewer than 20 percent of colleges and universities require the ACT or SAT for admissions purposes. Colleges that have stopped requiring these exams include lvy Leagues and other elite colleges. Most colleges in Oklahoma have suspended requirements of the ACT or SAT for admission purposes.

Some colleges, both state-wide and nationally, while no longer requiring these exams for admissions, do still use them for certain internal scholarship opportunities.
